DIRECTIONS TO THE CONFERENCE CENTER AT OCLC

FROM THE NORTH:

Merge onto I-71 N toward Columbus. Merge onto I-71 N via Exit 101A on the left toward Cleveland. Merge onto I-271 N via Exit 220 toward Erie PA. Merge onto I-77 N via Exit 10 toward Cleveland. Take the E 14th St. exit to the hotel.

FROM THE SOUTH:

Merge onto I-77 N via Exit 10 toward Cleveland. Take the E 14th St. exit to the hotel.

FROM THE EAST:

Merge onto I-70 E via Exit 44B toward Dayton - Crossing into Ohio. Merge onto I-270 N via Exit 93B toward Cleveland. Merge onto I-71 N via Exit 26 toward Cleveland. FROM THE WEST:

Speaker Biographies

C. MATTHEW CURTIN, CISSP - Founder, Interhack Corporation

C. Matthew Curtin is a computer scientist and cybersecurity expert. He leads Interhack's professional practice, addressing matters such as data breaches, intellectual property protection, computer crime, and use of data in litigation. Curtin has been engaged in criminal, civil, administrative, and military processes for both those bringing and defending actions, as well as for the court directly. His opinion has been accepted by federal and state courts throughout the country in hearings, trials, and in appeals.

In 1997 he helped to lead the DESCHALL project to defeat the U.S. Government Data Encryption Standard (DES) for the first time in open research using exhaustive key search. His book *Brute Force: Cracking the Data Encryption Standard* (Copernicus Books, 2005) tells the inside story of the effort and how it led to a change in policy regarding strong cryptography.

Curtin was the primary investigator in Interhack's Internet Privacy Project, showing how decisions made in the design and implementation of Internet-connected systems impact the security of computer systems and the privacy of their users. The work has been reported throughout the worldwide media and computer science literature. Curtin's previous book, *Developing Trust: Online Privacy and Security* (Apress, 2001) discusses these matters in detail.

Curtin has held an academic post as Senior Lecturer at The Ohio State University's Department of Computer Science and Engineering, and has guest lectured for the Privacy Foundation at the University of Denver's Sturm College of Law, Otterbein College, Franklin University, the Keller Graduate School of Management at DeVry University, and the Fisher College of Business at The Ohio State University.

As a volunteer, Curtin provides public service in emergency communications and emergency response. He is an amateur radio operator (KD8TTE), and carries qualifications and certifications in the FEMA Incident Command System (ICS), National Incident Management System (NIMS), National Weather Service SKYWARN, and is a member of the Franklin County Ohio Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) as well as the Ohio Amateur Radio Emergency Service Mutual Assistance Team (ARESMAT).

LARRY ZUKERMAN

Mr. Zukerman graduated from Case Western Reserve University School of Law and was admitted to the practice of law in the state of Ohio in 1985. Larry is an adjunct-professor of law at The Case Western Reserve University School of Law, where he has taught for thirteen years. Mr. Zukerman's teaching experience is not limited to the classroom. He has been selected to teach lawyers at seminars concerning a wide variety of subject matters. Larry is actively involved in the legal community and served as President of the Cuyahoga County Defense Lawyers Association, the Chair of the DUI Committee of the Ohio Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers, and the Chairman of the Cleveland Bar Association Criminal Law Section. Mr. Zukerman has also served as a Member of the Board of Directors of various state and local legal organizations. Mr. Zukerman is admitted to practice in all State and Federal Courts in the State of Ohio, The United States District Court for the Northern District of Ohio, The United States District Court for the Southern District of Ohio, The United States District Court for the Western Division of Michigan, The Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals and The United States Supreme Court. Mr. Zukerman's practice includes high profile white collar criminal defense, allegations of crime from internet/computer usage, as well as Federal narcotics cases. Mr. Zukerman also represents individuals in the State and Municipal Courts of Ohio.

DR. JULIE HEINIG - Assistant Laboratory Director

Dr. Heinig is in charge of the forensic laboratory operations at DNA Diagnostics Center. She performs DNA testing on crime scene evidence for DDC Forensics. Dr. Heinig designed and prepared DDC's forensic laboratory for accreditations by the prestigious FQS-I (Forensic Quality Services-International)/ISO IEC17025 and ASCLD/LAB-International, setting up the laboratory policies and procedures and performing validation studies.

Before joining DDC, Dr. Heinig spent 4 years as a Senior Forensic Scientist/DNA Analyst at the Cuyahoga County Coroner's office, where she performed testing on the highly publicized Dr. Sam Sheppard case. Dr. Heinig has appeared as an expert in a number of court cases testifying on her own casework and that of other scientists. She has extensive experience in processing crime scenes.

Dr. Heinig is an experienced lecturer, having hosted seminars and given lectures at the Coroner's office and offsite to various groups including attorneys, physicians and universities. She has also conducted crime scene evidence collection workshops for law enforcement agencies.

TERENCE F. MacCARTHY

Terry MacCarthy has been the Executive Director of the Federal Defender Program in the United States District Court for the Northern District of Illinois for over forty years. He was selected for this position in 1966 by the judges of the United States District Court and the deans of the six Chicago law schools. The office is frequently mentioned as being one of the best defender offices in the country. In addition to his overall administrative responsibilities, Mr. MacCarthy continues to personally try cases and to train and assist his staff of twenty attorneys.

He received a B.A. in philosophy from St. Joseph's College in 1955, and a J.D. from DePaul Law School in 1960. He was a law clerk to former Chief Judge William J. Campbell of the United States District Court for the Northern District of Illinois. He also served for several years as an Illinois Special Assistant Attorney General, specializing in civil trials and appeals. Mr. MacCarthy has been active principally in the field of trial practice, in both criminal and civil matters. He has argued in the United States Supreme Court. His criminal experience is primarily in the federal courts where he has tried and appealed many cases, and worked with his staff attorneys in preparing and trying additional cases. MacCarthy is one of the nation's most sought-after speakers at continuing legal education programs, having lectured in all 50 states and over a dozen foreign countries.

He has received numerous awards including special awards from both his undergraduate college and his law school. He received the University of Virginia Justice William Brennan Award, the Harrison Tweed Special Merit Award from the ABA and NLADA's Reginald Heber Smith Award. He has also received awards from, among other organizations, the National Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers, both the California and Illinois Attorneys for Criminal Justice, the ACLU, the National College of Criminal Defense, the Illinois State's Attorneys Association, the U.S. Army Trial Defense Services and the U.S.O. During the year 2000 he received the "Defender of the Century" from the Federal Defenders Association, the Inns of Court Professionalism Award from the Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit and the Charles English Award from the ABA Criminal Justice Section. In 2002 he received the Laureate Award of the Illinois State Bar Association. In 2004 he received the Public Interest Award for Excellence from the Chicago Chapter of the Federal Bar Association and the United Stated District Court of Illinois. In 2006 he received the First Defender Award from First Defense Legal Aid.

A member of the ABA for over thirty years, MacCarthy has chaired the Criminal Justice Section and has served on its Council for over twenty years, seven as a Section representative in the House of Delegates. He served on the Board of Governors from 1997 to 2000.

DALE COBB

Dale T. Cobb, Jr., is managing partner at the law firm of Belk, Cobb, Infinger & Goldstein in Charleston, South Carolina. He practices exclusively criminal defense. He is a co-founder of the South Carolina Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers, Chairman of the Board of the Wyoming Trial Institute, and has been a faculty member for the National Criminal Defense College since 1979. Dale helped pioneer the "Battered Spouse Syndrome" defense in the late 1970s, and has lectured in 45 states, Mexico, Puerto Rico, and Canada. His publications include: Criminal Procedure in South Carolina, Battered Spouse Defenses, and Acting for Lawyers (Welcome to the Theatre of the Absurd)
